





MOTHER LANGUAGE RIGHT MONITORING AND REPORTING STUDY

February 2023

Method and Goal

Center for Socio-Political Field Studies between **25 January - 5 February 2023**; On behalf of the "Children First Association", she conducted a field research on the **Kurmanjî and Kirmanjki/Zazaki** dialects of Kurdish in Diyarbakır for the **"Mother Language Right Monitoring and Reporting"** study.

The field research has been developed in order to support the use of mother language by children whose mother language is Kurmanji and Zazaki, the environments in which they use their mother language, access to tools developed for them to use their mother language, measuring it, and raising awareness about the right to mother language.

Within the scope of the study, face-to-face interviews were conducted with 260 children in Diyarbakır. The quantitative data of the interviews were transferred to the SPSS program, analyzed and reported. The questionnaire used in the interview was created in order to understand the child's age, gender, the level of use of the child's mother language, the possibilities of learning the mother language and their attitudes towards learning the mother language, awareness, perceptions and demands of the mother language right.

While the answers given to the questions were analyzed with tables and graphics, the answers given were also compared with the answers given to the questions of gender, age and what is your mother language.

The data obtained with the study; It shows that **Kurdish** is a candidate to be among the risky languages in terms of teaching, use and sustainability in Diyarbakır, that children do not continue their daily lives in the mother language to a large extent, that children do not have the opportunity to learn and speak their mother language outside of their families, and that families do not use this opportunity effectively. Another remarkable point is that those who have **Kirmancki / Zazaki** dialect speak/use their mother language with much less family members and in social activities than those with Kurmanji dialect. Although the data feeds the concerns about the future of both dialects of Kurdish, it shows that the zazaki dialect needs much more urgent measures.

54.6% of the research group participating in the study, in which striking results were obtained, were girls and 45.4% were boys. The study was carried out with the participation of the interviewees, 29.2% of whom were between the ages of 6-10, 54.6% between the ages of 11-14 and 16.2% between the ages of 15-17. While 83.1% of the children participating in the study declared that their mother tongue was Kurmanji dialect, 16.9% gave Kirmancki/Zazaki answers. On the other hand, 66.2% of the interviewees reported that they mostly spoke Turkish in the household, 24.6% spoke Kurmanji and 9.2% Kirmanjki/Zazaki. This rate makes us think that Kurdish is starting to move away from being a protected language by being used in the family and transferred to the next generations. The

answers given about the Frequency of Speaking the Mother Language in the Household also feed these concerns. Because, while 25.4% of the interviewees reported that they **always** speak their mother language at home, 37.7% reported that they **sometimes** used it, 20.8% **seldom**, 16.2% **never** used it. "Do You Speak Your Mother Language With Your Parents?" While 41.5% of the interviewees said **Yes**, 23.1% **No**, 35.4% Partially, 90% of the interviewees said that they use **Turkish**, 9.2% **Kurmanji** and 0.8% **Kirmancki/Zazaki** as the Language Mostly Spoken while Playing Street/Games. **The fact that the game language is mostly Turkish** indicates the existence of a serious risk regarding the use, preservation and transmission of Kurdish. However, it is noteworthy that the rate of children who want to learn/speak their mother language is 86.2%.

Also, "Do you know that you have the right to learn your mother language?" While 56.2% of the interviewees answered **Yes** to the question; "Do You Feel Anxious When Using Your Mother Language On The Street?" To the question, 3.1% of them said that they were **often** nervous, 8.5% of them **sometimes** and 45.4% of them said that they were **never** nervous. However, 27.7% of the participants said that they **do not know/speak their mother language.**

71.5% of the interviewees **Do you want to receive education in your mother language at your school?** While answering yes to the question; "Did you choose your mother language as an elective at school?" To the question, 32.6% answered **Yes** and 67.4% answered **No**. When asked why, 49.4% **replied that there was no such option**, 17.2% **did not have knowledge**, 11.5% **answered because I did not want it.**

Again, 80.8% of the participants answered "While being able to speak in the mother language is important", only 5.4% answered "Not Important". On the other hand, while 78.5% of the interviewees said that their mother language should be protected, "What do you think can be done to protect your mother language? to the question 40.8% of the interviewees answered the question as No Idea, 29.2% Needed to be Spoken, 9.2% Should Be the Language of Education, 9.2% Should Be Owned.

The principles of Comprehension, Speaking, Reading and Writing were asked to the interviewees in the research. The question has been posed. Accordingly, the interviewees

At the level of understanding, 23.1% Very Good, 37.7% Good, 28.5% Little Mirror, 10.8% I do not understand at all;

Principle of speaking 17.7% of them say **Very Good**, 30% of them **Good**, 30.8% of them say **I speak little**, 21.5% of them **I can't speak at all**;

Reading status 0.8% Very Good, 10% Good, 20.8% Little, 68.5% I can't read at all;

Writing units responded as 0.8% Very Good, 6.2% Good, 12.3% Little, 80.8% I Can't Write at All. As can be seen from the data, almost the total of the respondents do not know their mother language at Reading and Writing levels.

"Why don't you know?" When the question was asked, 68.2% of the interviewees answered Because My Family Doesn't Speak/My Family Doesn't Teach Me and 13.6% Because There Is No School and Resources Where I Can Learn My Mother Language.

Within the scope of the study, the participants were also asked how often their family members use their mother language in the household.

According to the answers given by the interviewees;

Those who say that my mother often uses **their** mother language are 29.2%, those who say that my father **often** uses their mother language are 30%; Those who say that the children aged 0-5 in the household **often** use their mother language are 5.4%; Those who say that children aged 6-11 **often** use their mother language are 6.2%; Those who say that children aged 12-17 **often** use their mother language are 9.2%; Those who say that children aged 0-5 **often** use their mother tongue are 5.4%; Those who say that family members between the ages of 18-24 use their mother language **frequently**, 7.7%; Those who say that family members between the ages of 25-34 use their mother language **frequently**; Those who say that their family members between the ages of 45-54 **often** use their mother language are 5.4%; Those who say that their family members between the ages of 55-64 use their mother language **frequently** are 10%; Those who say that family members aged 65 and over use their mother language **frequently** is 13.1%.

These data suggest that the presence of middle and older age groups is low in households, the prevalence of nuclear family structure, and that all three generations have weaknesses in the frequency of speaking/using their mother language in their households.

The interviewees who participated in the study were also asked which environment/resource was most effective in learning their mother language. According to this;

How Much Can You Learn Your Mother Language e Through Your Family? 48.5% of the question **Mostly**;

How Much Can You Learn Your Mother Language Through Friend/Neighbor? 6.9% to the question **Mostly**;


How Much Can You Learn Your Mother Language Through School? 93.1% Never, 5.4% Rarely;

How Much Can You Learn Your Mother Language Through Written Media Like Books/Newspapers/Magazines? 78.5% **Never**;


How Much Can You Learn Your Mother Language Through Television Channels Broadcasting In Your Mother Tongue? 62.3% **Never**,

How much can you learn your mother language through oral narratives such as music, fairy tales, cartoons? 60% of them gave the answer to the question **Never**. These answers show that children's areas of learning and using their mother language are mostly within the family.


The detailed report of the study with graphics and tables is as follows.



Of the interviewees in the research group, 54.6% were **Girls** and 45.4% were **Boys.**



29.2% of the children in the research group are **6-10 years old**, 54.6% are **11-14 years old**, and 16.2% are **15-17 years old**.



The question "What is your mother language" was asked to the interviewees in the research group. Accordingly, 83.1% of the interviewees responded as Kurmanji and 16.9% as Kirmanjki/Zazaki.

Of the Boys, 84.7% Kurmanji, 15.3% Kirmanjki/Zazaki;

Of the Girls, 81.7% gave Kurmanji and 18.3% Kirmanjki/Zazaki answers.



76.3% of the interviewees between the ages of 6-10 were Kurmanji, 23.7% Kirmanjki/Zazaki,

84.5% of the interviewees between the ages of 11-14 were Kurmanji, 15.5% Kirmanjki/Zazaki,

90.5% of the interviewees **between the ages of 15-17** gave **Kurmanjî** answers and 9.5% **Kirmanjki/Zazaki** answers.



What Language Do You Speak More in Your Home to the interviewees in the research group? question was posed. Accordingly, 66.2% of the interviewees answered in Turkish, 24.6% in Kurmanji and 9.2% in Kirmanjki/Zazaki.



70.4% of the interviewees whose mother tongue is Kurmanji are Turkish, 29.6% are Kurmanjî;

Of the interviewees whose mother tongue was Kirmanjki/Zazaki, 54.5% gave Kirmanjki/Zazaki and 45.5% Turkish answers.










